

COUNSELLING BASED-SKILL TRAINING OF MATERNIT STAFF ON WHO'S "TEN STEPS TO SUCCESSFU **BREASTFEEDING" (4 DAYS)**

This is a unique skill training programme for the hospital staff working in maternity area to implement WHO's "Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding" /Government of India's MAA programme guidance. This has been developed by the Breastfeeding Promotion Network of India (BPNI), who has the expertise and pioneered in developing such training programmes. This training course is usually held in collaboration with a maternity hospital setting, with 26 sessions of theory and clinical practice skills to enable maternity staff to support mothers during pregnancy, at the time of birth and during hospital stay before discharge. These skills contribute to success in initiating breastfeeding within an hour of birth, skin-to-skin contact and maintain exclusive breastfeeding during hospital stay-both in vaginal and caesarean births. This training prepares the staff to get their maternity hospital accredited as "Breastfeeding Friendly"- a new BPNI initiative.

OBJECTIVE OF THE COURSE

Equip maternity staff with knowledge, expertise, communication and support skills for success of breastfeeding in health facilities.

On completion of this course participants will be able to:

- Provide breastfeeding counselling for feeding of new born babies in the health facility setting
- Assist in implementing 'Ten Steps to successful breastfeeding'.
- Help mothers to initiate breastfeeding within an hour of birth and skin-to-skin contact.
- Help mothers achieve comfortable position for herself and effective suckling position of the baby at the breast.
- Provide practical solutions to breastfeeding mothers who have problems like sore nipples, engorgement or "not enough milk"
- Teach mothers the techniques of expressing breastmilk and cup feeding.
- Assist in changing hospital practices to make it a 'Breastfeeding Friendly' facility.

DURATION

4 days: 20 hours classroom sessions plus 6 hours of clinical practice



CERTIFICATION

WHERE THE COURSE IS HELD

Course is held in Maternity Hospital in different parts of country.

TYPE OF TRAINING

The training course is highly participatory and interactive. It has classroom sessions, lectures, practice classes, hospital visits, discussions, demonstrations, exercises, role-plays and group work. The clinical practice is the hallmark of this course; 3 times during 4 days. Participants practice their skills with mother and baby pairs in the wards. In different clinical practice sessions, the participants practice listening and learning skills, building confidence and giving support, assess and observe a breastfeed, position a baby at the breast, expression of breastmilk and cup feeding and taking breastfeeding history.

LANGUAGE

The course is presently conducted in English/Hindi and other local language where the course is held, as counselling practices with mothers are held in local language.
